Platform Access & BackOffice Login

Credential Distribution

Secure login credentials are generated and distributed by the Supsindex Scientific Team via email.



Faculty Portal Access

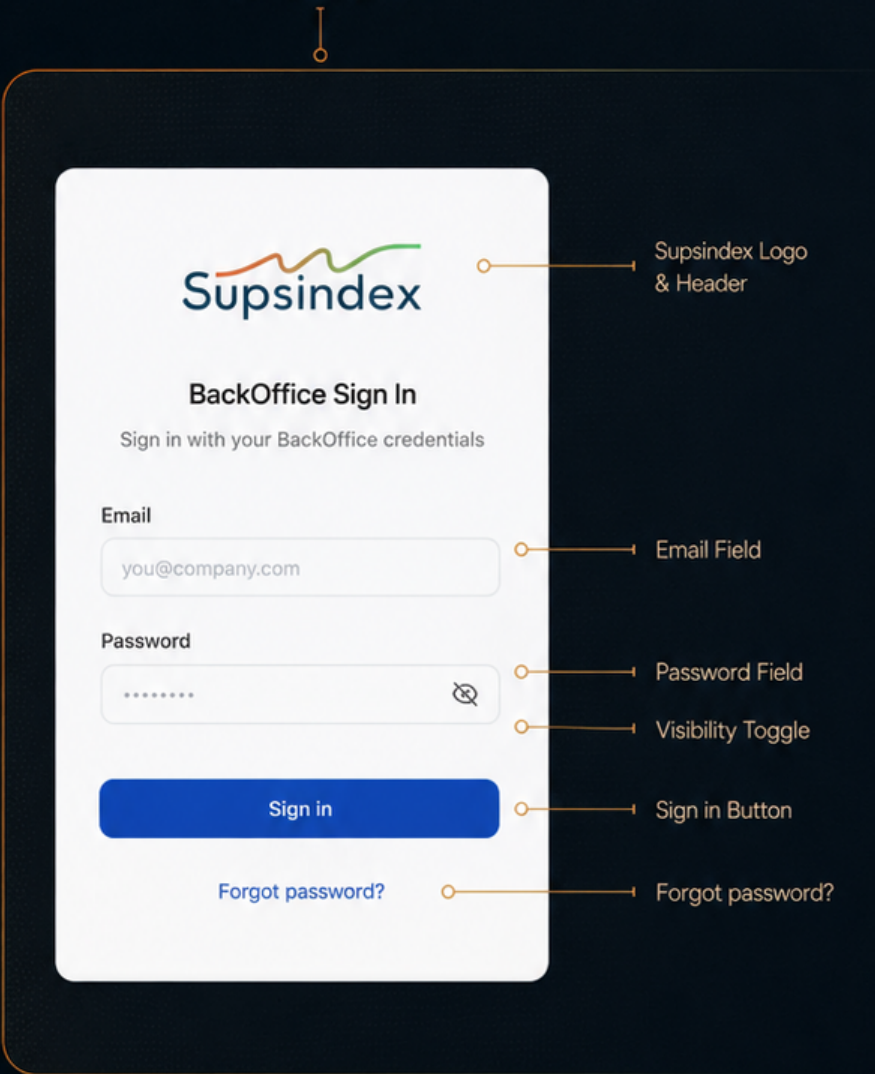
These credentials provide entry to the dedicated Faculty Portal, directly connected to the assessment engine.

Domain Matching

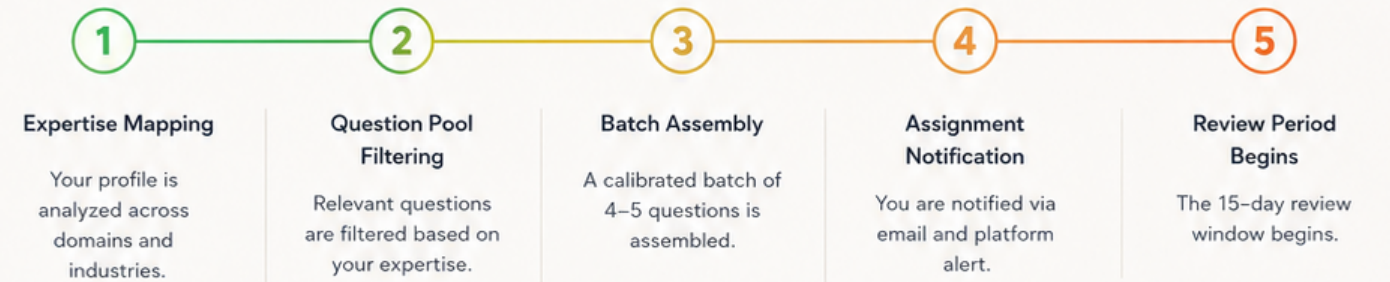
Assignments are algorithmically matched to your declared expertise across 55 distinct industries and functional domains.

Turnaround Time & Deadlines

You have 15 calendar days from the date of assignment to complete your reviews for the entire batch.



Forfeiture of Vote

If the deadline is missed, your voting privilege for the batch will be forfeited. The system will reassign the questions to another qualified faculty member.



Blackout Dates

During designated blackout periods, no new batches will be assigned, and reviews will be paused to accommodate academic and global events.

Independent Review Model

A cornerstone of the Supsindex review process is independent validation, supported by anonymity, diversity of perspective, and reviewer calibration.

Three Independent Faculty Reviews

- ✓ Each question is independently reviewed by exactly three faculty members.
- ✓ The identities of the other two reviewers remain strictly confidential.
- ✓ This methodological blindness protects the integrity of the review process.



Triangulated Judgment

The system synthesizes three independent perspectives to arrive at a final decision.



Strict Anonymity

Reviewers remain anonymous to one another throughout the process, ensuring independent methodological judgment without peer influence.



Diversity of Perspective

Faculty members come from varied backgrounds such as entrepreneurship, research, mentoring, corporate management, and venture ecosystems. Divergent viewpoints are expected and mathematically essential to triangulation.



Professional Conduct

When disagreements arise, Supsindex does not take sides. Every faculty opinion is valued and treated with professional respect.



Calibration Tracking

At scale, the system monitors for 'Hawks' and 'Doves'—reviewers who disproportionately reject or accept items. Significant deviations from the mean may trigger calibration training.

Must Evaluate

The core responsibility of the Faculty Member is to evaluate alignment.

Logical Connection

Assess whether all components work together coherently.

2



Question Stem

The scenario or inquiry should isolate the target competency with clarity and no conceptual drift.

3



Answer Choices

Options must be calibrated, mutually exclusive, and aligned to the same dimensional scale.

4



Correct Answer Rationale

The justification should be objective, explicit, and empirically grounded.

5



Rigorous Connection to the Stated Criteria

The stem, choices, and rationale must align tightly with the competency being measured.

6



Constraint

Reviewers may suggest improvements to the question, but must not modify or comment on the criteria itself.



Do Not Evaluate

1

Startup Stage Appropriateness

Do not assess whether the question belongs to Seed, Growth, or another stage. Stage suitability has already been pre-calibrated by Supindex experts.

2

Criteria Validity

Do not evaluate whether the listed criteria are correct, important, or relevant. The criteria have already been reviewed and approved by specialist committees.



The Goal: Structural Validity

The question should measure exactly what it claims to measure, without ambiguity, irrelevant variables, or conceptual drift.

The goal is structural validity.

Decision-Making Framework

Reviewer actions and final system outcomes ensure structured, efficient, and scientifically governed question disposition.



REVIEWER ACTIONS



Approve

Use when the question is scientifically valid, logically aligned with the prompt criteria, free of bias, and ready to proceed.



Improve

Use when the foundation is acceptable, but wording, answer choices, or rationale require refinement. Clear, actionable feedback must be provided.



Reject

Use when the question is obsolete, biased, theoretically flawed, or fundamentally disconnected from the stated criteria. A clear justification must be provided.



FINAL SYSTEM OUTCOMES



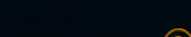
Approved



The question moves directly to the approved question bank, subject to a randomized managerial spot-check.



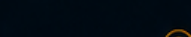
Conditionally Approved



Minor revisions are applied by a scientific manager before final approval.



Requires Major Revision



The question is returned for structural revision and typically re-reviewed by the original reviewers requesting changes.



Rejected



The item is permanently discarded to preserve methodological quality and operational efficiency, unless manually salvaged by a manager.



By structuring reviewer actions and system outcomes, Supindex transforms question evaluation into a disciplined scientific decision architecture.
